It is the Department's view that transposition of the Electricity Directive should not have any impact, positive or negative, on the needs of people living, working or operating businesses in rural areas. The legislation will transpose the articles within the Directive regarding updating the duties and obligations on the Regulatory Authority. Areas within the Directive which require further policy development will be taken forward separately and will be subject to impact assessments in due course.

The Department consulted with relevant stakeholders through the issue of a public consultation document on the transposition of the Electricity Directive. This allowed stakeholders the opportunity to respond to the Department on a number of questions raised in the consultation. The consultation was issued on 3 September 2020, closing on 16 October 2020.

There were 2 responses from individuals who had concerns around Battery Energy Storage Schemes and the potential tendency for these systems to spontaneously combust producing toxic gases.

Energy storage is outside the scope of this consultation and will be taken forward as an integral part of the Department's Energy Strategy. The issues raised by the individuals will be forwarded to the Energy Strategy team.
