

# Statistical Bulletin

## Destinations of Leavers from UK Higher Education Institutions: Northern Ireland analysis 2008/09

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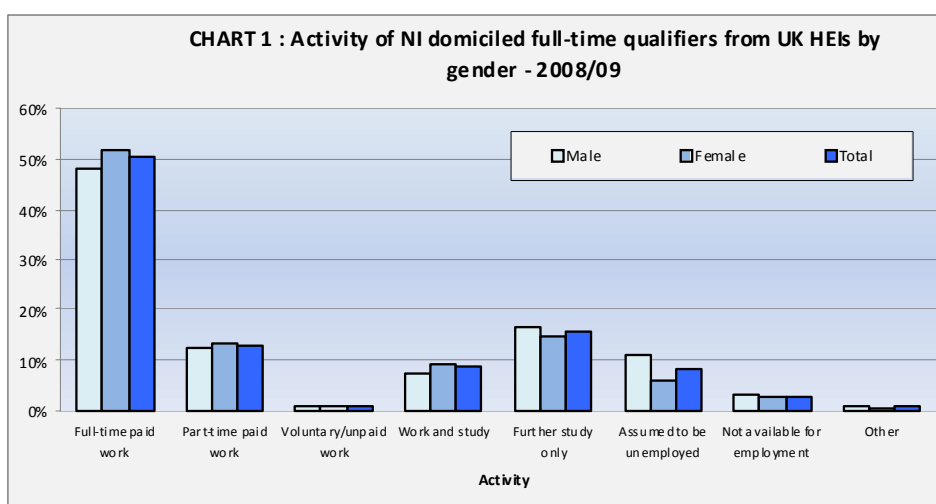
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This statistical bulletin has been produced by the Department for Employment and Learning, Northern Ireland (NI), using data collected by the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA).

It provides details of the activities and destinations of students, six months after graduation, who obtained qualifications at NI Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and NI domiciled students who obtained qualifications at UK HEIs in the academic year 2008/09.



## KEY POINTS

### Destinations of NI domiciled students gaining qualifications at UK Higher Education Institutions (Tables 1 to 8)

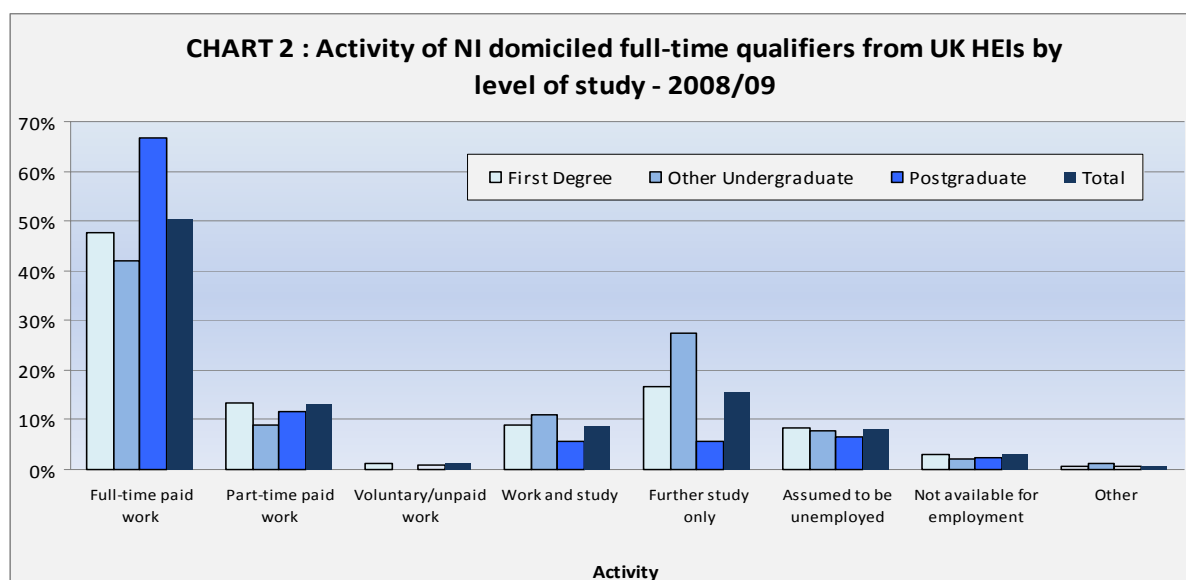
#### Response rate

There were 11,090 NI domiciled respondents to the 2008/09 Destinations of Leavers from Higher Education (DLHE) survey from a target population of 13,595, a response rate of 82%. Of those who responded 315 provided no usable information (explicit refusals). These 315 respondents have therefore been excluded from the analysis.

#### Activity six months after graduation (Table 1, Charts 1 & 2)

##### Full-time qualifiers

- Six months after graduation, 50% of NI domiciled full-time qualifiers were in full-time work, 13% were in part-time work, 1% in voluntary work and 9% combining work and further study – a total of 73% in employment. A further 15% were in further study only, 8% were unemployed, 3% were not available for employment and 1% were engaged in other activities.
- Gender – six months after graduation, 69% of NI domiciled full-time male qualifiers were in employment compared to 76% of females. Males (11%) were more likely to be unemployed than females (6%).
- Level of study – six months after graduation, 71% of NI domiciled full-time first degree qualifiers were in employment compared to 62% of other undergraduate qualifiers and 85% of postgraduate qualifiers. First degree qualifiers (17%) and other undergraduate qualifiers (27%) were more likely to be in further study only than postgraduate qualifiers (6%).



## Part-time qualifiers

- Of those NI domiciled qualifiers who were studying part-time, 65% were in full-time work, 10% in part-time work, 1% in voluntary work and 15% were combining work and study – a total of 90% in employment. The remainder of qualifiers were in further study only (3%), unemployed (3%), not available for employment (2%) and other (1%).
- Gender – NI domiciled female part-time qualifiers (91%) were more likely to be in employment than males (89%). However males (70%) were more likely to be in full-time employment than females (62%), with females more likely to be in part-time work (12%) or combining work and study (16%) than males (6% and 13% respectively).
- Level of study – NI domiciled postgraduate part-time qualifiers (94%) were more likely to be in employment than first-degree (86%) and other undergraduate (88%) qualifiers. Over a quarter of part-time other undergraduate qualifiers (27%) were combining work and study, compared to 14% of part-time first degree and 13% of part-time postgraduate qualifiers.

## **Employment**

Qualifiers in employment include those in full-time work, part-time work, voluntary work and those combining work and study.

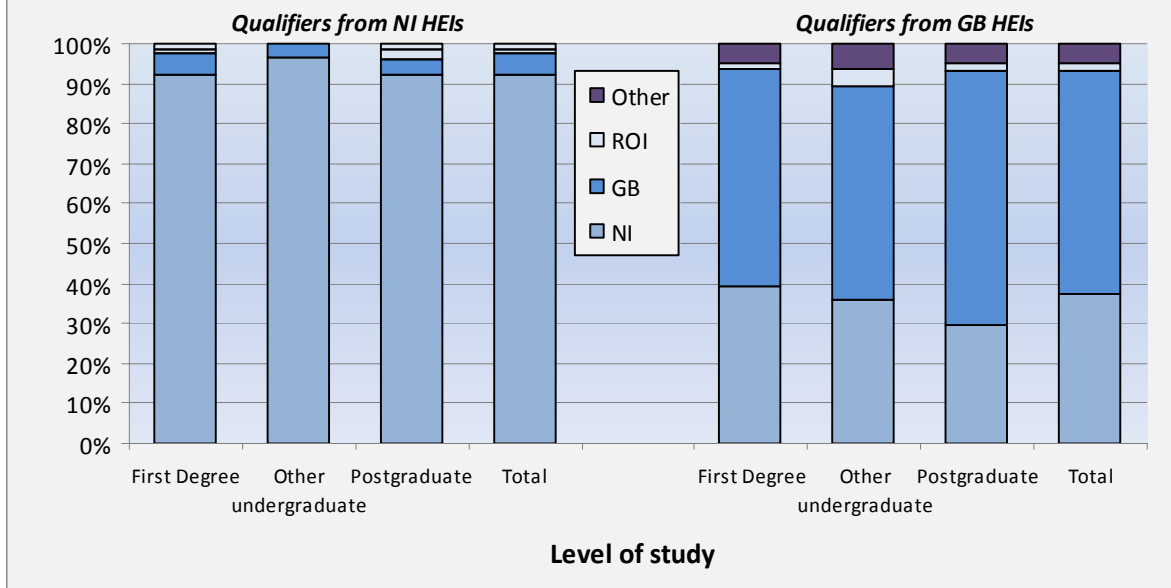
### **Employment - Location of Employment (Tables 2a, b & c, Chart 3)**

Qualifiers whose location of employment was unknown have been excluded from the analysis, this represents less than 1% of those respondents in employment.

## Full-time qualifiers

- Of those NI domiciled full-time qualifiers in employment six months after graduation, 75% were employed in NI, 22% in GB, 1% in ROI and 2% elsewhere.
- Location of study – 92% of NI domiciled full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in NI, 5% in GB, 1% in ROI and 1% elsewhere. The comparable figures for NI domiciled qualifiers from GB HEIs are 38% employed in NI, 57% in GB, 2% in ROI and 3% elsewhere.
- Gender – 76% of NI domiciled full-time female qualifiers in employment were employed in NI, compared to 73% of males
- Level of study - 77% of NI domiciled full-time first degree qualifiers in employment were employed in NI compared to 62% of other undergraduate and 67% of postgraduate qualifiers.

### Part-time qualifiers

- 92% of NI domiciled part-time qualifiers in employment six months after graduation were employed in NI, 5% were employed in GB, 2% in ROI and 1% elsewhere.
- Location of study – 97% of NI domiciled part-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in NI, compared to 79% of NI domiciled part-time qualifiers from GB HEIs (including OU).
- Gender – 94% of NI domiciled part-time female qualifiers in employment were employed in NI, compared to 89% of males
- Level of study - 94% of NI domiciled part-time first degree qualifiers in employment were employed in NI compared to 90% of other undergraduate and 92% of postgraduate qualifiers.

## **Employment – Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) (Tables 3)**

Qualifiers in employment whose SOC was unknown have been excluded from the analysis, this represents less than 0.2% of those respondents in employment.

### Full-time qualifiers

- Of those entering employment, 65% of NI domiciled full-time qualifiers took up positions in the top 3 SOC groups (Managers & Senior Officials, Professional Occupations or in Associate Professional & Technical Occupations).
- Gender – NI domiciled full-time male (65%) and female (65%) qualifiers in employment were equally likely to be employed in the top 3 SOC groups.
- Level of study - 60% of NI domiciled full-time first degree qualifiers in employment were employed in the top 3 SOC groups, compared to 65% of other undergraduate and 88% of postgraduate qualifiers.

### Part-time qualifiers

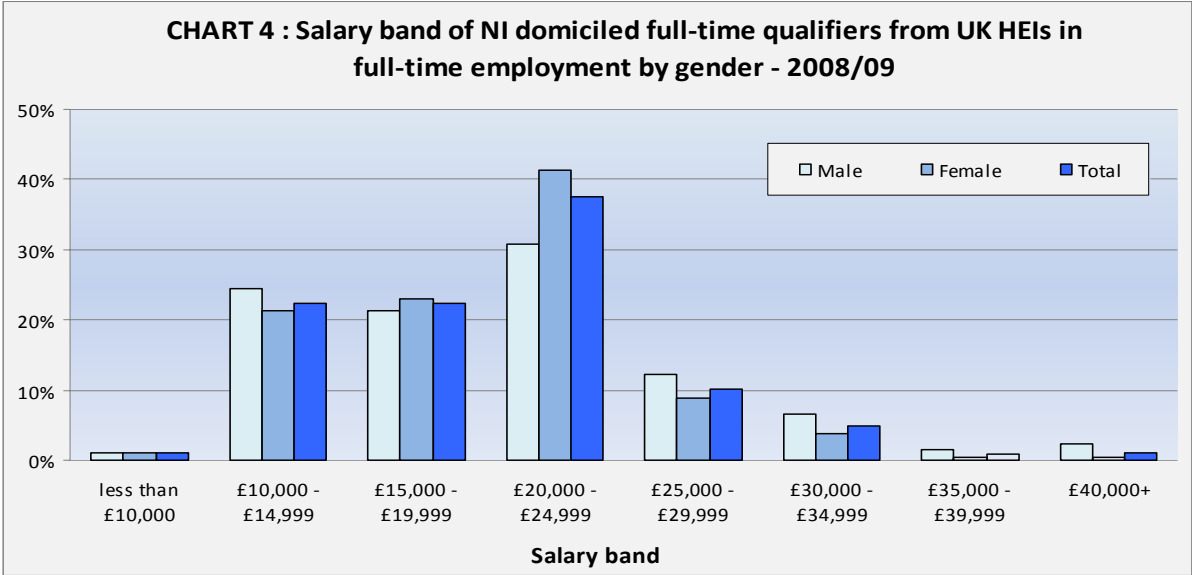
- 81% of NI domiciled part-time qualifiers in employment were employed in the top 3 SOC groups.
- Gender – NI domiciled part-time males (84%) in employment were more likely to be employed in the top 3 SOC groups than their female (80%) counterparts.
- Level of study - 65% of NI domiciled part-time first degree qualifiers in employment were employed in the top 3 SOC groups, compared to 80% of other undergraduate and 94% of postgraduate qualifiers.

**Employment – Salary of those in Full-time employment (Tables 4 - 7, Chart 4)**

Qualifiers in full-time employment whose salary was unknown have been excluded from the analysis, this represents 55% of those respondents in full-time employment. Salary is not a mandatory question in the DLHE survey resulting in a high non-response rate. Information on salary should therefore be interpreted with caution.

Full-time qualifiers

- The average salary of NI domiciled full-time qualifiers in full-time employment was £19,485 (median £20,000).
- Gender – NI domiciled full-time male qualifiers in full-time employment had an average salary of £20,115 (median £20,000). The equivalent female qualifiers had an average salary of £19,130 (median £20,000).



- Level of study – The average salary of NI domiciled full-time first degree qualifiers in full-time employment was £18,940 (median £19,000), compared to other undergraduate qualifiers - £20,825 (median £21,000) and postgraduate qualifiers - £21,740 (median £21,000).
- Location of study - NI domiciled full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment had an average salary of £18,850 (median £20,000). The equivalent figure for NI domiciled full-time qualifiers from GB HEIs was £20,635 (median £21,000).
- Location of employment – The average salary of NI domiciled full-time qualifiers in full-time employment in NI was £18,355 (median £18,000). NI domiciled full-time qualifiers in full-time employment in GB had an average salary of £21,765 (median £21,000).

- Standard Occupational Classification – The average salary of NI domiciled full-time first degree qualifiers in full-time employment was lowest for those in Elementary occupations - £12,130 (median £12,000) and highest for those in Professional Occupations - £21,940 (median £21,000).

### Part-time qualifiers

- The average salary of NI domiciled part-time qualifiers in full-time employment was £28,600 (median £26,000).
- Gender – NI domiciled part-time male qualifiers in full-time employment had an average salary of £31,150 (median £30,000). The equivalent female qualifiers had an average salary of £27,060 (median £25,000).
- Level of study – The average salary of NI domiciled part-time first degree qualifiers in full-time employment was £24,070 (median £23,000), compared to other undergraduate qualifiers - £27,960 (median £25,500) and postgraduate qualifiers - £32,285 (median £30,000).

### **Further Study (Tables 1 & 8)**

Qualifiers in further study include those in further study only and those combining work and further study.

### Full-time qualifiers only

- 24% of NI domiciled full-time qualifiers were in further study 6 months after graduation. Of those 66% were studying for a postgraduate qualification, 7% for a first degree, 10% for a professional qualification, 14% for other qualifications and 3% were not aiming for a qualification.
- Level of study – 26% of NI domiciled full-time first-degree qualifiers were in further study compared to 38% of other undergraduate and 11% of postgraduate qualifiers. Of those in further study, first degree qualifiers were most likely to be studying for a postgraduate qualification (68%); other undergraduate qualifiers were most likely to be studying for a first degree (66%) and postgraduate qualifiers were most likely to be studying for another postgraduate qualification (66%).

## Destinations of students gaining qualifications at NI Higher Education Institutions (Tables 9 to 16)

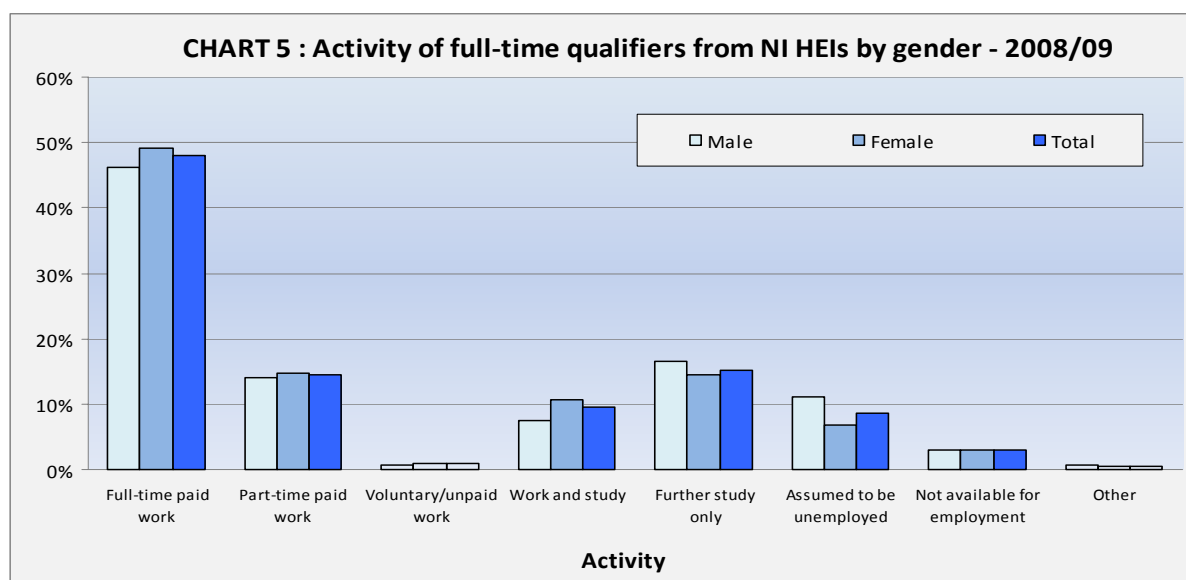
### Response rate

There were 8,380 respondents from NI HEIs to the 2008/09 DLHE survey from a target population of 10,340, a response rate of 81%. Of those who responded 225 provided no usable information (explicit refusals). These 225 respondents have therefore been excluded from the analysis.

### Activity six months after graduation (Table 9, Chart 5)

#### Full-time qualifiers

- Six months after graduation, 48% of full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs were in full-time work, 14% were in part-time work, 1% in voluntary work and 9% combining work and further study – a total of 73% in employment. A further 15% were in further study only, 9% were unemployed, 3% were not available for employment and 1% were engaged in other activities.
- Gender – six months after graduation, 69% of full-time male qualifiers from NI HEIs were in employment compared to 75% of females. Males (11%) were more likely to be unemployed than females (7%).
- Level of study – six months after graduation, 71% of full-time first degree qualifiers from NI HEIs were in employment compared to 70% of other undergraduate qualifiers and 82% of postgraduate qualifiers. First degree qualifiers (17%) and other undergraduate qualifiers (22%) were more likely to be in further study only than postgraduate qualifiers (6%).





## Part-time qualifiers

- Of those qualifiers from NI HEIs who were studying part-time, 69% were in full-time work, 10% in part-time work, 0% in voluntary work and 11% were combining work and study – a total of 91% in employment. The remainder of qualifiers were in further study only (4%), unemployed (3%), not available for employment (2%) and other (1%).
- Gender – Male (91%) and Female (91%) part-time qualifiers from NI HEIs were equally likely to be in employment. However males (77%) were more likely to be in full-time employment than females (65%), with females more likely to be in part-time work (13%) or combining work and study (13%) than males (10% and 11% respectively).
- Level of study – Postgraduate part-time qualifiers from NI HEIs (94%) were more likely to be in employment than first-degree (87%) and other undergraduate (88%) qualifiers. Over a fifth of part-time other undergraduate qualifiers (21%) were combining work and study compared to 10% of part-time first degree and 11% of part-time postgraduate qualifiers.

## **Employment**

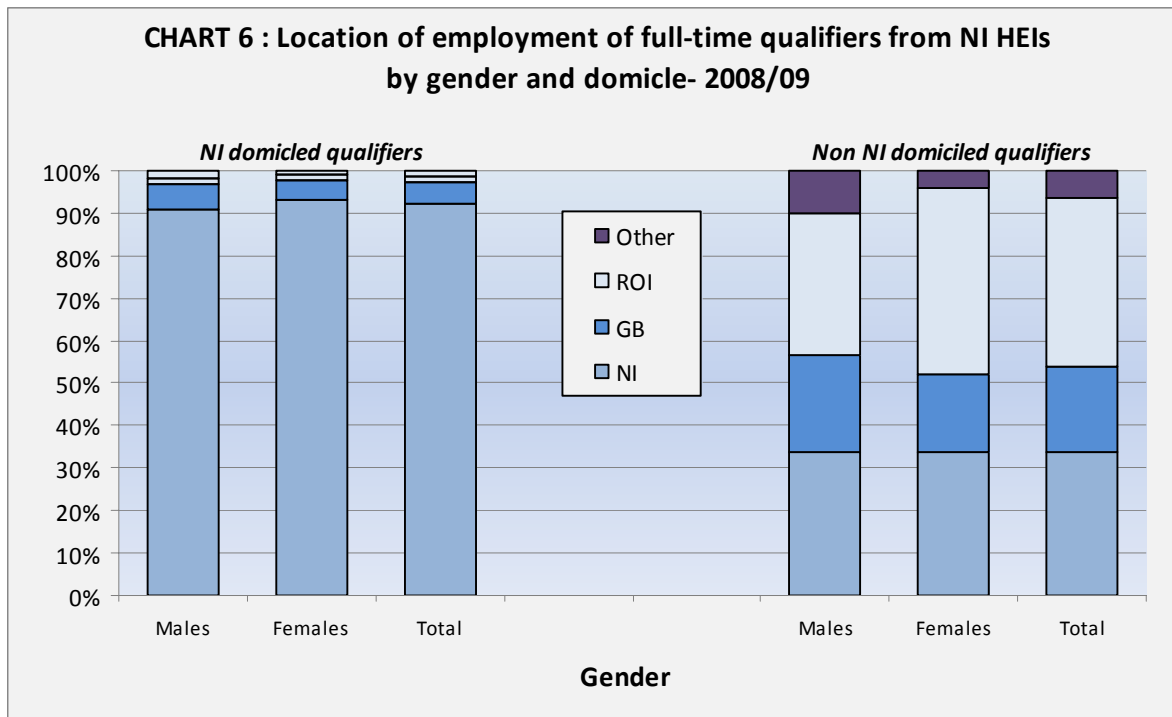
Qualifiers in employment include those in full-time work, part-time work, voluntary work and those combining work and study.

### **Employment - Location of Employment (Tables 10a, b & c, Chart 6)**

Qualifiers whose location of employment was unknown have been excluded from the analysis, this represents less than 1% of those respondents in employment.

## Full-time qualifiers

- Of those full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment six months after graduation, 88% were employed in NI, 6% in GB, 4% in ROI and 2% elsewhere.
- Country of domicile – 92% of NI domiciled full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in NI, 5% in GB, 1% in ROI and 1% elsewhere. The comparable figures for non NI domiciled qualifiers from NI HEIs are 34% employed in NI, 20% in GB, 40% in ROI and 6% elsewhere.
- Gender – 89% of full-time female qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in NI, compared to 87% of males
- Level of study - 89% of full-time first degree qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in NI compared to 97% of other undergraduate and 82% of postgraduate qualifiers.



### Part-time qualifiers

- 81% part-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in NI, 6% were employed in GB, 13% in ROI and 1% elsewhere.
- Country of domicile – 97% of NI domiciled part-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in NI, compared to 11% of non NI domiciled part-time qualifiers from NI HEIs.
- Gender – 83% of part-time female qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in NI, compared to 76% of males
- Level of study - 93% of part-time first degree qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in NI compared to 82% of other undergraduate and 73% of postgraduate qualifiers.

## **Employment – Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) (Tables 11)**

Qualifiers in employment whose SOC was unknown have been excluded from the analysis, this represents less than 0.2% of those respondents in employment.

### Full-time qualifiers

- Of those entering employment, 62% of full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs took up positions in the top 3 SOC groups (Managers & Senior Officials, Professional Occupations or in Associate Professional & Technical Occupations).
- Gender – 62% of full-time male and 61% of full-time female qualifiers from NI HEI in employment were employed in the top 3 SOC groups.
- Level of study - 57% of full-time first degree qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in the top 3 SOC groups, compared to 63% of other undergraduate and 84% of postgraduate qualifiers.

### Part-time qualifiers

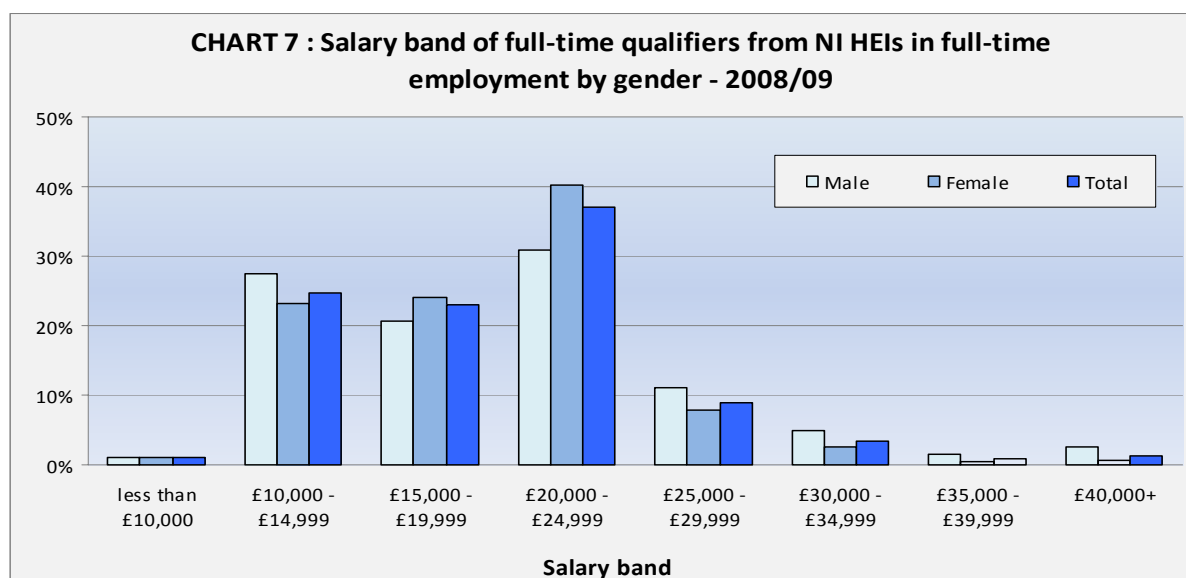
- 85% of part-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in the top 3 SOC groups.
- Gender – 86% of part-time male and 85% of part-time female qualifiers from NI HEI in employment were employed in the top 3 SOC groups.
- Level of study - 66% of part-time first degree qualifiers from NI HEIs in employment were employed in the top 3 SOC groups, compared to 97% of other undergraduate and 95% of postgraduate qualifiers.

## Employment – Salary of those in Full-time employment (Tables 12-15, Chart 7)

Qualifiers in full-time employment whose salary was unknown have been excluded from the analysis, this represents 56% of those respondents in full-time employment. Salary is not a mandatory question in the DLHE survey resulting in a high non-response rate. Information on salary should therefore be interpreted with caution.

### Full-time qualifiers

- The average salary of full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment was £19,135 (median £20,000).
- Gender – Full-time male qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment had an average salary of £19,725 (median £20,000). The equivalent female qualifiers had an average salary of £18,825 (median £20,000).



- Level of study – The average salary of full-time first degree qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment was £18,545 (median £18,000), compared to other undergraduate qualifiers - £18,315 (median £20,000) and postgraduate qualifiers - £22,195 (median £21,000).
- Country of domicile - NI domiciled full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment had an average salary of £18,850 (median £20,000). The equivalent figure for GB domiciled full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs was £18,600 (median £14,000).

- Location of employment – The average salary of full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment in NI was £18,395 (median £19,000). Full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment in GB had an average salary of £21,990 (median £21,000).
- Standard Occupational Classification – The average salary of full-time first degree qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment was lowest for those in Elementary occupations - £11,710 (median £11,200) and highest for those in Professional Occupations - £21,075 (median - £21,000).

### Part-time qualifiers

- The average salary of part-time qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment was £31,050 (median £28,000).
- Gender – Part-time male qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment had an average salary of £34,165 (median £30,000). The equivalent female qualifiers had an average salary of £29,195 (median £26,500).
- Level of study – The average salary of part-time first degree qualifiers from NI HEIs in full-time employment was £24,460 (median £24,000), compared to other undergraduate qualifiers - £27,375 (median £25,000) and postgraduate qualifiers - £35,250 (median £32,000).

### **Further Study (Tables 9 & 16)**

Qualifiers in further study include those in further study only and those combining work and further study.

#### Full-time qualifiers only

- 25% of full-time qualifiers from NI HEIs were in further study 6 months after graduation. Of those 69% were studying for a postgraduate qualification, 5% for a first degree, 8% for a professional qualification, 15% for other qualifications and 2% were not aiming for a qualification.
- Level of study – 27% of full-time first-degree qualifiers from NI HEIs were in further study compared to 43% of other undergraduate and 11% of postgraduate qualifiers. Of those in further study, first degree qualifiers were most likely to be studying for a postgraduate qualification (70%), other undergraduate qualifiers were most likely to be studying for a first degree (50%) and postgraduate qualifiers were most likely to be studying for another postgraduate qualification (69%).

## Notes to Readers

### General

1. **HESA** - The Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) is the official agency for the collection of information on publicly funded Higher Education institutions (HEIs) in the UK. It was set up in 1993 following the white paper "Higher Education: a new framework", which called for more coherence in Higher Education statistics. HEIs include all publicly funded universities. HESA data do not include enrolments at Further Education colleges in Northern Ireland or Great Britain, or enrolments at institutions in the Republic of Ireland.
2. **DLHE** – This Statistical Bulletin is based on data returned to HESA in respect of the 'Destinations of Leavers from Higher Education (DLHE) survey 2008/09'. The DLHE survey is carried annually and provides information on the activities of students approximately six months after graduation. HESA published a statistical first release based on the 2008/09 DLHE on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2010, providing a high level UK analysis. The HESA report can be downloaded from the HESA website at <http://www.hesa.ac.uk/index.php/content/view/1775/161/>.
3. **Location of Employment error** - Following publication of HESA's 2008/09 DLHE Statistical First Release on 1 July 2010 they identified a minor error affecting a small number of students who were incorrectly coded as "unknown" in the location of employment derived fields. Given the minor effect of the error it was decided not to revise the tables and commentary in this bulletin
4. **Target population** – The HESA DLHE target population includes all those UK and EU domiciled leavers whose study was full-time or part-time at a UK HEI and who obtained relevant qualifications (see note 6) reported to HESA for the reporting period 1st August 2008 to 31st July 2009.
5. **Exclusions** - The population for the DLHE return does not represent the full cohort graduating during the reporting period; examples of those excluded from the target population are listed below:
  - Qualifiers graduating with professional qualifications (e.g. associate membership or membership of a body such as the Institute of Bankers) or undergraduate diplomas and certificates (other than foundation degrees, HND, DipHE, HNC and CertHE).
  - Non EU domiciled qualifiers.
  - Qualifiers whose mode of study was recorded as dormant during the reporting period. (This will include for example students submitting a thesis and students retaking exams during the reporting period).
6. **Response rate** - Of all NI domiciled qualifiers for whom DLHE information was expected, 82% responded (83% of full-time and 74% of part-time qualifiers). Of all qualifiers from NI HEIs for whom DLHE information was expected, 81% responded (83% of full-time and 74% of part-time qualifiers).

7. **Relevant qualifications** for inclusion in the 2008/09 DLHE return are listed below:

### **Postgraduate**

Doctorate degrees, Postgraduate Certificates in Education, Other Postgraduate qualifications include masters degrees; other postgraduate qualifications obtained primarily through advanced supervised research; Masters of Business Administration (MBA); pre-registration masters degrees and other taught qualifications at level M leading towards obtaining eligibility to register to practice with a health or social care or veterinary statutory regulatory body; postgraduate bachelors degrees at level M; other taught qualifications at level M including those leading towards registration with the Architects Registration Board (Part 2 qualification).

### **First degree**

Integrated undergraduate/postgraduate taught masters degrees on the enhanced/extended pattern, and first degrees with honours on the enhanced/extended pattern at level H; first degrees with honours/ordinary first degrees (including those leading to qualified teacher status (QTS)/registration with a General Teaching Council (GTC), but excluding those from the intercalated pattern); first degrees with honours leading towards registration with the Architects Registration Board (Part 1 qualification); pre-registration first degrees with honours/ordinary first degrees leading towards obtaining eligibility to register to practice with a health or social care or veterinary statutory regulatory body; first degrees with honours and diploma; postgraduate bachelors degrees at level H.

### **Other undergraduate**

Foundation degrees, graduate diplomas/certificates at level H; other qualifications at level H including those leading towards registration with the Architects Registration Board (Part 2 qualification); graduate diplomas/certificates at level I; Diplomas of Higher Education (DipHE) (including those leading towards obtaining eligibility to register to practice with a health or social care or veterinary statutory regulatory body); Higher National Diplomas (HND); Certificates of Higher Education (CertHE); Higher National Certificates (HNC).

8. **The survey dates** for this 2008/09 DLHE return were 20 April 2009 (if the leaver obtained the qualification between 1 August 2008 and 31 December 2008) and 11 January 2010 (if the leaver obtained the qualification between 1 January 2009 and 31 July 2009).

### **Definitions**

9. **Higher education** students for the purpose of HESA's data collection are those students on courses for which the level of instruction is above that of level 3 of the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA) National Qualifications Framework (NQF) (e.g. courses at the level of Certificate of HE and above).

10. **Domicile** refers to a student's permanent place of residence prior to enrolment on an HE course.
11. **Other UK** includes Wales, Guernsey, Jersey and the Isle of Man.
12. **GB** includes England, Scotland, Wales, Guernsey, Jersey and the Isle of Man.
13. The **Open University** is counted as a wholly English institution. The administrative centre is located in England, although The Open University teaches throughout the UK.
14. The '**Explicit Refusal**' category refers to those who replied to the survey but explicitly refused to give information. This category is included in tables 1&9, but has been excluded from the analysis in the key points.
15. **Mode of study** distinguishes students studying full-time or part-time:
  - I. *Full-time* includes full-time and sandwich modes plus those writing-up where the mode of study was previously full-time and students changing to dormant status previously full-time.
  - II. *Part-time* includes those studying part-time, full-time for less than 24 weeks in the academic year, block release or studying during the evenings, plus those writing-up theses and previously part-time.

### **Rounding strategy**

16. To prevent the identification of individuals, figures in the attached tables are rounded to the nearest 5, with 0, 1, 2 rounded to 0. Due to rounding the sum of numbers in each row or column may not match the total shown. Percentages and averages are based on unrounded figures. Averages based on populations of 7 or fewer have been suppressed.
