


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

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Statistics on Accommodation in May 2011

Average room occupancy in Bed and Breakfasts (B&Bs) and Guesthouses (GHs) in Northern Ireland in May 2011 was 37%, an increase of 5 percentage points when compared with the same month last year. Average room occupancy in Hotels in May 2011 was 62%, a decrease of -2 percentage points when compared with May 2010.

Average bed space occupancy in B&Bs and GHs in May 2011 was 28%, an increase of 3 percentage points when compared with May 2010. Average bed space occupancy in May 2011 in Hotels was 43%, an increase of 1 percentage points compared with the same period in 2010.

During May 2011 an estimated 35,600 bedrooms and 61,700 bedspaces were sold across all B&Bs and GHs, showing an increase of 20% on the number of rooms sold and 16% on the bedspaces sold when compared with sales in May 2010.

An estimated 149,100 bedrooms and 232,900 bedspaces were sold across all Hotels in May 2011. This is a decrease of -1% and -5% respectively on the number of rooms sold and the number of bedspaces sold compared with the same period in 2010.

The hotel occupancy survey is a census of all certified hotels in Northern Ireland, the data has been weighted for non-response assuming no non-response bias. The GH and B&B is a disproportionate stratified sample. The data is weighted by local authority which differs from pre 2010 weights, therefore pre-2010 cannot be compared directly to data in this publication.



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January-May Occupancy

Hotel Classification

During January-May 2011, four/five star hotels experienced the highest room and bed-space occupancy (55% and 39% respectively). However, these hotels experienced the largest declines in occupancy rates from the same period in 2010 (-3 percentage points and -2 percentage points respectively). Three star hotels were the only classification to show improvement when compared with January-May 2010 (room and bed-space occupancy rates were each up by 2 percentage points). Table 2 shows the room and bed-space rates for hotels by classification.

Hotel Size

During January –May 2011, the smallest hotels (25 rooms or less) experienced falls in both room and bed occupancy rates. The largest hotels (100+ rooms) experienced a fall in room occupancy rates (Table 3)

Price of Room

During January-May 2011, hotels with rooms priced $\pounds 60$ or more experienced a fall in room occupancy rates of -1 percentage point when compared with the same period in 2010. All other priced hotels saw an increase in occupancy over the period. Table 4 shows the room and bed-space occupancy rates for hotels by price.
